DROP OFF SITE INFORMATION

Properly disposed medication helps prevent prescription drug abuse, illegal use, and contamination of our water supply. Disposal can also prevent an overdose related to a mental health crisis. What can I drop off in the box?

Prescription medications, over-the-counter medication (OTC), inhalers, and liquids.

What is PROHIBITED?

NO sharps, thermometers, or business medicines are allowed in the drop boxes.

How easy is it to drop off medications?

Very! It is safe and anonymous. No ID required. No questions asked. Cross out names on the original container, and place it in the box.

What if I don't have an original container?

Put it in a clear plastic bag and write the name of the medication on the bag.
